



## SDG 10 : Reduced inequalities

Inequality represents a major and influential problem. To reduce inequality, Amman Arab University has provided equal opportunities for students to accept, work, participate in activities and events, and represent the university in conferences. It also adopts this approach in the way it appoints members of its faculty members and administrative staff, regardless of gender, race or religion. Or a sect, equality is its goal.

### Amman Arab University has played this role through the following:

1. Introducing new educational programs to teach leaders of the future the multi-disciplinary challenges of sustainable development by introducing subjects into study plans such as a human rights course, an Islamic culture course, and a national education course that rejects the discourse of hate, violence and resentment.
2. Enhancing research programs in universities on sustainable development by focusing on joint and international research between researchers from different countries.
3. Contributing to the establishment of sustainable projects inside or outside universities, which were based on providing equal opportunities for students to be accepted.
4. The university also works on appointing members of the faculty members and administrative staff, regardless of gender.



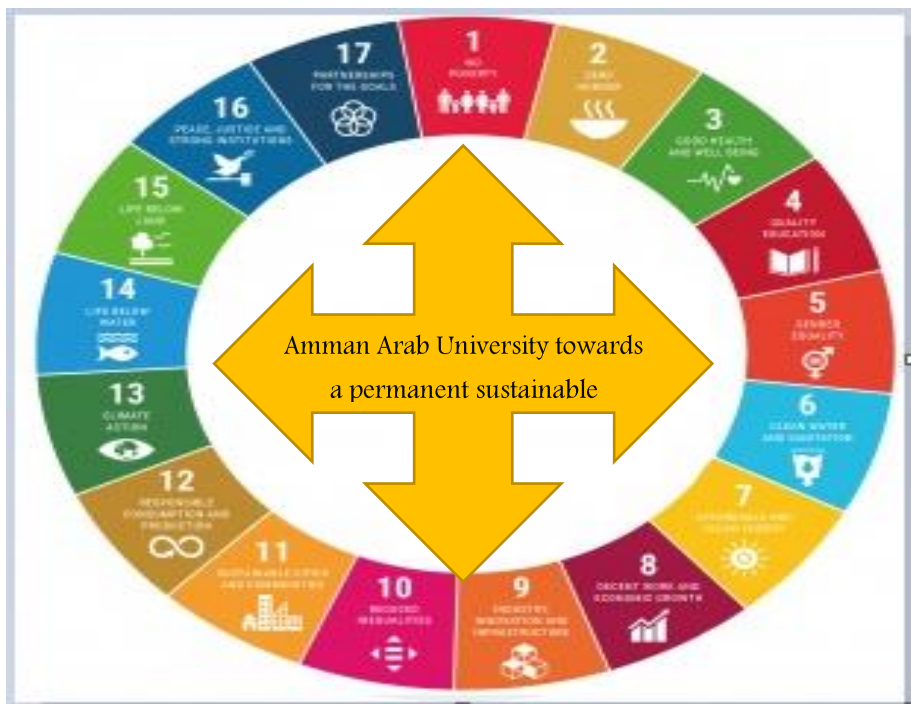
**The proportion of refugees in the world's population has more than doubled since 2010 for every 1,000,000 people, there are 311 refugees (year 2020-2021)**
