Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification and halt and reserves land degradation and halt biodiversity loss



This goal of the sustainable development goals aims to preserve and restore the use of terrestrial ecosystems such as forests, wetlands and drylands, and stopping forests is vital to mitigate the effects of climate change, as humans depend on agriculture as an important economic hub and as a means of development. The role of the university in this goal is achieved through:

Adopting specific methods for disposing of medical and paper waste, and this was done by signing an agreement to recycle paper.

Working on planting evergreen trees to contribute to improving the climate. In addition, the university holds Tree Day celebrations as a service to the local and national community.

Her Highness Princess Basma bint Ali, may God protect her, the founder of the Royal Botanical Garden, sponsored the celebration organized by the park in cooperation with Amman Arab University on Tree Day, which falls on January 15 of each year, in the presence of the President of the University, Prof. Mohamed Al-Widyan, the garden staff and University staff.

The park administration granted Amman Arab University an area of (25) dunums of land of the Royal Park for planting with trees that the park worked to preserve from extinction. The celebration included planting trees in order to contribute to afforestation efforts with the participation of a number of students of Amman Arab University.

On the sidelines of the celebration, a team from the Royal Botanical Garden briefed on the restoration of the Tree Museum in the Royal Botanical Garden, which will be sustained by Amman Arab University.
